The need for a human rights impact assessment

We have reiterated our call for a human rights impact assessment to ensure the most vulnerable in society are not disproportionately impacted by covid-19 In light of new clusters confirmed among the Traveller community and in Direct Provision Centres.

The government must do more to protect vulnerable communities in our society during this public health emergency, including those living in Direct Provision, members of the travelling community, homeless people and all those living in congregated settings without proper facilities.

We have <u>reissued our appeal to the public</u> to support this call for a human rights impact assessment.
